Current CCE Projects

Security

The CCE has a direct and very active relationship with the **Fidellity ADT management, control room and response vehicle.** We get daily updates from ADT with regards to response vehicle activity, CCTV activations, feedback on any resident complaints and general security updates. This enables every Chartwell resident to benefit from our collective buying power that ensures we get the best possible service at a very reasonable price, currently R350/ month for full armed response.

CCTV Camera's – We currently have 16 overview camera's, 3 licence plate recognition camera's & 2 thermal river camera's, all monitored and responded to by ADT security. The cost of all these cameras is funded by the CCE. We would ultimately like to have a CCTV camera pole on every street corner and at least 10 thermal camera's positioned at strategic spots along the river.

Cedar Road boundary wall – the CCE recently funded and implemented the reconstruction of over 170 meters of the Cedar Road north boundary wall. This means that our Cedar Road boundary is now finally secured and will not break down continually.

The Chartwell blockwatch - security for the community, by the community. This initiative is fully endorsed and backed by the CCE.

Aesthetics and beautification

Street paving project – we are currently paving various pedestrian walkways within Chartwell. As part of our 'Taking back the Streets' project, we would like to see every street in Chartwell in a state of good repair with all of them having well-kept verges and paved pedestrian walkways on as many as possible.

APPRECIATE OUR HERITAGE By Maureen Dalglish

Plots 133 and 134 on the corner of 3rd Road and Romney Avenue belong to the City of Johannesburg.

On this site, however, are six graves, dating prior 1900, which makes them of historical and heritage interest.

Through the efforts of Chartwell resident and Conservancy member, Paul Furniss, the site has been given to the Chartwell Conservancy for safekeeping on the condition that the graves are preserved. SAHRA – South African Heritage Resource Agency, which is part of the Department of Arts and Culture, has undertaken to do some research to find out more about the graves and has commended Paul Furniss and the Chartwell community on taking the necessary steps to fence and clear the vegetation surrounding them. Only graves older than 60 years are treated as heritage resources.

The surname "Robbertse" appears to be shared by some family members. L.N.R. Robberts was a Voortrekker. Wessel Hendrik Robbertse died during the Anglo-Boer War.

Recently a group of Chartwell Conservancy members met on the site on a Saturday morning and marked out a suitable track around the property (no holes, wires or rubble) to make it safe for horse riders, dog walkers and joggers to enjoy. The surface of the land has deliberately not been disturbed to prevent weeds from growing on it and after the rain is most pleasant to walk on. Please Chartwellians – appreciate and enjoy your surroundings – NO litter please! NO motorbikes!


